This interdisciplinary workshop (SST1) will explore the key concepts of **Responsible Research and Innovation (RRI), citizen engagement, and co-creation** in the context of climate-related challenges, with a focus on gamification. How can these approaches help make climate information services more accessible and relevant to citizens? Participants will delve into the **5-helix model**, which promotes collaboration between academia, industry, government, civil society, and the environment, from the perspective of the NGO CESIE ETS. Through **open discussions and hands-on activities**, participants will learn about RRI principles and how they can be applied in practice. The workshop will also explore co-creation for sustainable cities, drawing from the CRETHINK experience. Additionally, a session will be dedicated to **gamification for citizen engagement**, using the example of the Utrecht City Game. Finally, the **ClearClimate Board Game – "Our Sustainable Planet"** will be introduced as a tool to raise climate awareness and drive action, starting with children. Participants will explore potential game evolutions to engage citizens and communicate climate change issues in an alternative way.
